ABOUT CIRCA

Returning for a second year, Circa: Queer Histories Festival is the first and only LGBTQ+ histories festival in the United States. Hosted by One Institute, the oldest operating queer organization in the country, Circa will take place during LGBTQ+ History Month, October 2024. The month-long programming series showcases the trailblazing histories and vibrant cultural contributions of LGBTQ+ communities through the lens of present-day challenges and triumphs. Spanning the arts, humanities, politics, and culture, Circa features queer and trans thinkers and doers leading the movement for LGBTQ+ liberation.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

Program proposals may be explicitly about queer historical events or individuals. We also welcome proposals that loosely, creatively, and expansively approach queer history.

What we mean by Queer Histories Programming

One Institute (One) invites queer, trans, and allied community members, artists, activists, scholars, youth, educators, cultural institutions, and community organizations to submit innovative, thought-provoking program proposals. We welcome proposals from across the arts, cultural, and humanities disciplines in the form of: performances, screenings, readings, lectures, dialogues, podcasts, workshops, exhibitions, pop-ups, parties, multidisciplinary programs, and more. We are currently prioritizing in-person programs from Los Angeles-based programmers but will also accept virtual programs accessible to broader audiences.

Circa 2024 Theme: LOVE and (R)EVOLUTION

From the streets to the privacy of our homes, LGBTQ+ folks have been rabble rousers and changemakers for generations, insisting on our rights to pleasure, gender expression, and chosen family. We know what it is to uplift one another in times of turmoil, and that our community's greatest strength is love. As a queer and trans history organization, One Institute

acknowledges the revolutions of our predecessors that have changed the world, and the ones we're fighting today. Our movement is constantly evolving with trans and BIPOC folks at the forefront, and emerging communities on the horizon.

In 2024 we invite proposals that consider the role of *LOVE and (R)EVOLUTION* in our histories and contemporary culture. With so many challenges ahead for our LGBTQ+ communities, including the pivotal Presidential election, let's remember, "*An army of lovers shall not fail.*" (from *Sappho's Reply*, Rita Mae Brown)

CIRCA PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- By submitting your proposal, you or your organization agree to partake in the Circa Festival, and to produce and host a program during LGBTQ+ History Month, October 2024 in person in Los Angeles County or virtually from anywhere in the world.
- 2. Proposals from individual artists may be for new and/or previously presented works, or works-in-progress.
- 3. Programs are self-funded by the individual, group, or organization that submits the proposal. Program support for eligible applicants is described below.
- 4. Accepted programs will receive robust print and online marketing and publicity support, including inclusion in the Circa festival calendar, microsite, and social media marketing campaign.
- 5. A limited number of program venue spaces will be made available at low to no cost to accepted proposals at one of our Circa program hubs including One Gallery in West Hollywood and the Los Angeles LGBT Center in Hollywood. These venues offer space and limited audio/visual equipment. There may be a cost to the programmer for tech heavy programs, or programs that require rehearsals.
 - o <u>Indicate on application if you would like to be considered for free to low cost</u> <u>venue space.</u>
 - o Please note, Circa programming hubs cannot host mounted exhibitions. If your program proposal is for a mounted exhibition, you will need to find your own venue and be responsible for curation and installation.
- 6. Late or incomplete program proposals, or those that do not fit Circa's guidelines or thematic considerations, may be rejected.
- 7. <u>Please limit your application to one program idea per proposal.</u>

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADDITIONAL SUPPORT

One Institute recognizes the time and effort that goes into producing high-quality programming for our communities. We offer additional programming support to participating individuals and organizations, according to these eligibility guidelines:

- A limited number of stipends of up to \$500 are reserved for small and emerging nonprofits and individuals who may be asked to demonstrate need.
- Applicants are eligible for free to low-cost program venue spaces on a case-by-case basis, depending on availability.
- All applicants are eligible for consultation with one of our expert volunteer Programming / Curatorial Advisors, upon request.
- All applicants are eligible for print and digital marketing and publicity support.

HOW WE SCORE CIRCA PROGRAM PROPOSALS

The curatorial and educational choices made by One Institute are guided by our commitment to social equity and justice. We engage with the complexity of LGBTQ+ history and representation through highlighting the intersectional narratives of Black, Indigenous, people of color (BIPOC), women, gender- nonconforming and transgender people, people of various abilities, youth, and elders across all socio-economic classes.

To evaluate proposals, the Circa Steering Committee will score applications on a scale of 1-5 through the following categories:

• <u>Program Design</u>

Circa seeks original proposals with a strong and clear artistic vision. Committee members will assess program quality, clarity of execution, demonstrated social relevance to the Trans and Queer community, and alignment with the mission of Circa.

Intended Audience & Equity

Circa believes in the importance of inclusive and attractive programming. Committee members will assess each program's ability to reach underserved and marginalized audiences, as well as marketability and aptitude for serving as a high-profile event, and accuracy of audience size communicated in the application. *We recognize not every program will attract similar audiences, but submissions should communicate its potential for significant reach.*

• Experience & Expertise

Circa takes place in Los Angeles, home to a diverse range of talent who execute experiences with varying levels of available resources. Committee members will assess applicants' history of programming in LA as well as their experience with production and event logistics.

<u>Access and Accessibility</u>

Circa is working to ensure programs are accessible and responsive to the needs of our audience. Committee members will assess whether programs address accessibility needs and language barriers in a thoughtful and consistent manner.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Please submit your program proposal via our online <u>Jotform application</u> by 11:59 PM PST on Sunday, April 14, 2024. Applicants will be notified via email before May 31, 2024.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

*Asterisks denote required fields. All applications must be submitted via our online <u>Jotform</u> <u>application</u>. It is strongly recommended that you draft your answers to the following questions in a separate document and enter into the Jotform for submission when complete.
